

Government agrees on new COVID-19 crisis resolution measures:

From **1th of November 2021**, the following requirements apply for participants in consultations and exams:

Obligation to wear a mask to be extended to controlled indoor activities.

People aged 12-17 required to present a COVID certificate or test certificate when participating in controlled activities

Only evidence of vaccination or proof of recovery from COVID-19 disease is valid as COVID evidence.

1. COVID vaccination certificate

- The vaccination course has been completed (1/1, 2/2, etc).
- At least 14 days have passed since the last vaccination, 7 days for Pfizer / BioNTech Comirnaty.
- Maximum one year has passed since the last vaccination.

2. COVID recovery certificate

- More than 11 days and no more than 180 days have passed since the date of the positive PCR test.

As of 1 November, **people aged 12-17 (included)** will also be required to present a COVID certificate in order to participate in controlled activities. In addition to a certificate of vaccination or recovery from the disease, minors can also submit a negative result of a PCR or rapid antigen test to participate in events and activities. The PCR test must be done no more than 72 hours and the rapid antigen test no more than 48 hours before the event and by a professional healthcare service provider.

People aged 18 and older are required to present a vaccination or recovery certificate as before.

o Certificate will be checked by the examination board. The certificate must be presented together with a valid identification document before entering the examination hall.

o The safety of the infection does not need to be demonstrated by a person under the age of 18, ie he or she does not have to provide proof of vaccination or COVID-19 recovery.

o For the moment of identification, please remove the mask.

o If you do not have a certificate to prove that you are not COVID19 infectious, you will not be allowed to the examination.

o If you are not allowed to the examination, please let the examination board know if you wish the Education and Youth Board to register you to the next possible examination.

o If you are in the COVID-19 risk group, we highly recommend considering postponing the examination. You can cancel your registration and the Education and Youth Board can register you to the next possible examination.

o If you have any symptoms of illness (low fever, dry cough, headache, muscle ache) or a family member or a person from the same household who is COVID-19 positive, you cannot come to the examination. Alert the Education and Youth Board of the circumstances prior to the examination.

o Please do not come to the examination if you are not feeling well on the day of or the previous day of the examination. At the latest, call on the day of the examination on 7350 565 or email sulvi.botker@harno.ee. In this case you will not need a certificate for your absence, and you will be registered to the next possible exam.
