



## HISTORY

1919 - Tallinn Teachers' Seminar was established in Tallinn

1947 - The Teachers' Seminar becomes Tallinn Teachers' Institute

**1952 -** Tallinn Teachers' Institute is renamed Tallinn Pedagogical Institute

**1988** – A group of intellectuals established the Estonian Institute of Humanities (EHI). EHI has operated as part of Tallinn University since 2005 and is now named the School of Humanities.

18 March 2005 – A parliamentary decision by the Republic of Estonia consolidated several Tallinn universities and institutes into a single institution that resulted in the founding of Tallinn University as a public university. The Baltic Film and Media School was established within Tallinn University. It is the only university college in northern Europe in which it is possible to study film, television and media in English.

**2015** - The Senate approved the new <u>Development Plan (2015-2020)</u>, which sets our goal to promoting intelligent lifestyle.

**2019** – Tallinn University Act came into force. The University is a legal person in public law.




#### The dynamics of university revenues 2016-2021 (M euros)



<sup>\*</sup> Revenues from research and development are calculated taking into account data from consolidated annual report




# Financing of Tallinn University's RD (research and development) projects by fields of science 2021 (%)
